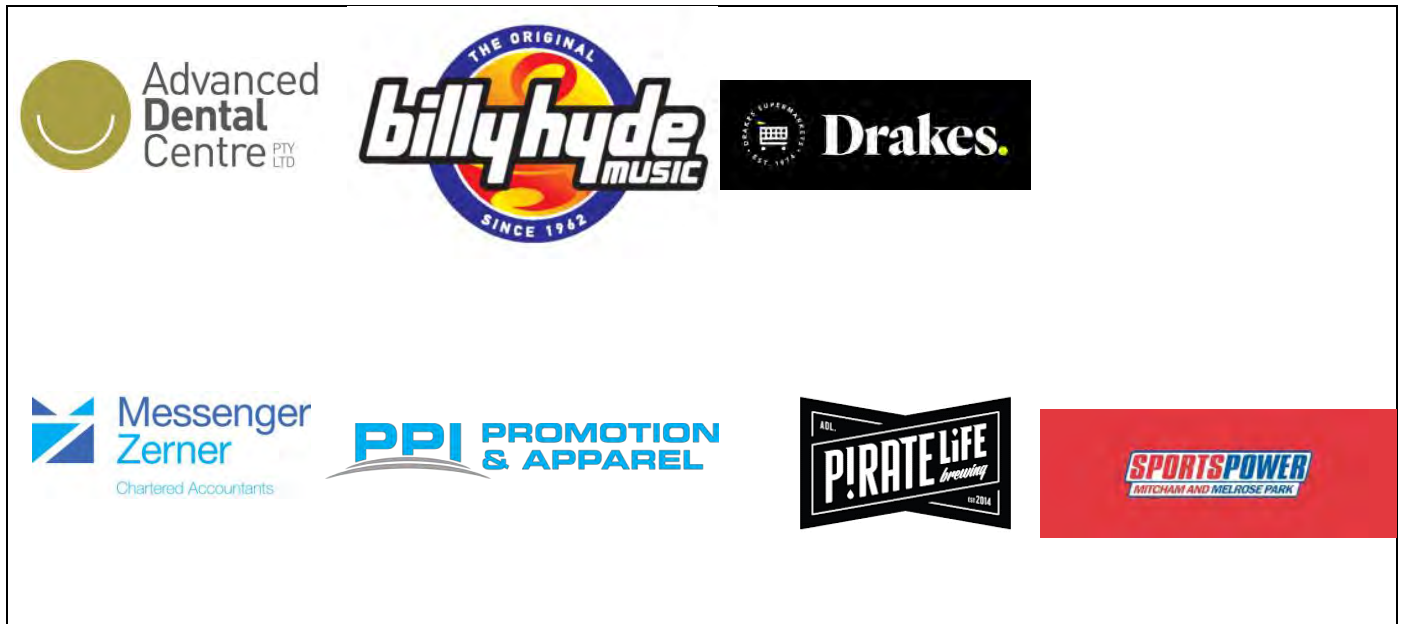

Little disappointed with a couple of major pieces of equipment that needed to be replaced during the year with both the compressor and temp rite cooler both failing within a week of each other and just out of warranty after only two years.

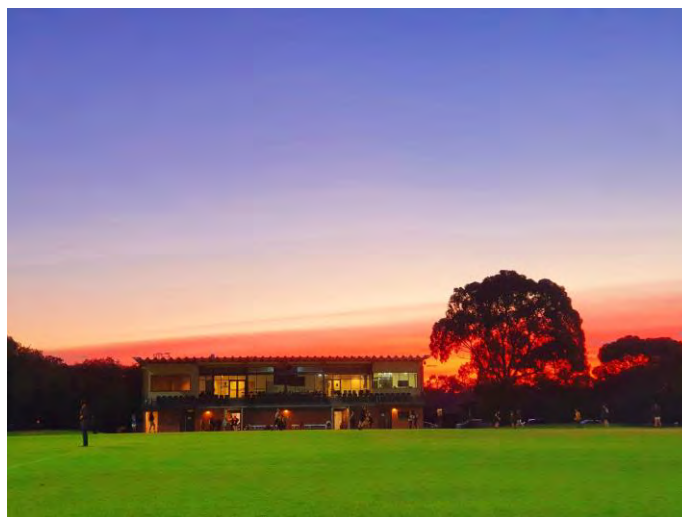

Director of Football's Report | Daniel Norton

Season 2022 was another strong season for Goodwood Saints on the field, across the breadth of all our football programs.

From a men's perspective, all our senior teams qualified for finals with our C1 team playing in the Grand Final. Well done to C1 coach and club great Jason Fleming who, in his first season as coach, led the team throughout an outstanding season, losing only two games, both to eventual premiers PAOC.

The C-grade coaching role is arguably the most challenging in the club in relation to selection and access to players, but Flemmo has done a brilliant job in keeping our players connected and aligned.

Disappointingly, despite consistent Minor Round performances none of our senior teams tasted premiership success.

After guiding our Division 1 reserves team to finals and ultimately a 4th placed finish, Simon Brooks has decided to change roles within our program and in 2023 will support Luke Donaldson as an assistant coach in Division 1.

Returning next season as Division 1 reserves coach is Ben Johnstone who needs no introduction. BJ coached the Division 1 reserves team to consecutive premierships in 2020 and 2021 and after a year away from coaching is excited to return to work with assistant coach Dave Serotzki.

From a Division 1 perspective, the team finished the home-and-away season in second spot but was ultimately exposed in our final two finals outings losing heavily to Port Districts in the Second-semi-final and PAOC in the Preliminary final. It was a disappointing way to end our season and highlighted the need for improvement in key areas. Not many players achieve this double, and Fav should be most proud of the player he's become.

Ultimately its premiership trophies that matter most here at **Goodwood. Seeing the disappointment on Fav's face after the preliminary final** tells me he knows this more than anyone. Again, congratulations on a great season in the midfield. We look forward

to another strong season from you in 2023 in our pursuit of the ultimate team success.

Men's Senior Football Director's Report | Andrew Forrest

D1 – under the guidance of our senior coach Luke Donaldson, the team had an indifferent start to the season with 1 win from the first 3 games. Followed with six wins, we found ourselves top of the ladder at the halfway point of the season. The team showed some indifferent form in the second half of the season however we still managed to finish the minor round in second position and secure a double chance.

After a strong qualifying final win at Goodwood Oval, we were well beaten in the second semi and preliminary finals. These two disappointing losses meant we finished 3rd overall and highlighted areas where we need to improve i.e., leg speed, fitness, and team structure in some parts of our game.

D1R – club legend Simon Brooks took charge of this team for his first season in a coaching role. As in previous seasons this team was full of exciting young talent which was a great development opportunity for the Club. In a high-quality competition, the team finished 4th in the minor round with 13 wins however couldn't progress past the 1st semi-final to finish 4th overall. More importantly, valuable experience and development was gained by the young group which will stand them in good stead for future D1 selection.



C1 – another club legend in Jason Fleming was in a coaching role for the first time with the C1 team. Jason did a fantastic job in managing a large squad (68 players total) and losing only one game to finish minor premiers. Unfortunately, our young squad couldn't quite match a more experienced opposition in the Grand Final to finish runners up. It was fantastic to see so many Goodwood Saints juniors play in this team throughout the year and, as with the D1R team, exciting times lay ahead with further development and experience.

Under 17.5 – Kym Laube stepped up to coach this team at short notice. For varying reasons this is potentially a difficult age group to coach, but Kym did an outstanding job in moulding a large squad into a cohesive team unit by finals time. The team won just five minor round games to finish 5th but amazingly won all four finals games to storm to the U17.5 Div 1 premiership! The talent the team has and the game style they played certainly is very exciting for our club going forward.

Inclusive – following the retirement of long serving Coach Gary Sutherland, Mike Lawton took charge of this team for season 2022. With some mixed results through the year the boys finished just outside the top 4 in fifth position. However, the contribution this team makes to our Club and the wider community is simply outstanding. This is aided by the fantastic support team around the boys which includes the coaches, carers, and families.

There is a large team of people that make a football department function, without them we would simply not get teams on the field each week. The senior women's program had another superb year of development and achievement in 2022. Building on our success in 2021, our A grade women's side moved up from Division 4 to Division 3, and our B grade from Division 7 to Division 2 Reserves (D2R). To provide some context, D2R is a dedicated division for all clubs able to field a B grade women's team. It was a bonus for us that this year the A and B grade women's teams were able to play back-to-back at the same oval on eight Saturdays, up from only four last year. This really helped to develop our sense of squad identity and cohesion which is a key objective of our women's program.

Highlights of the season included participating in our inaugural Pride Round against Flinders Park, where both teams participated in pre-game activities to celebrate and embrace our LGBTQIA community (we also rolled out our snazzy new club Pride socks on the field!). Thanks to Flinders Park for initiating this with us; we hope to be able to continue the tradition well into the future. We were also greatly honoured to participate in the Indigenous Round against Golden Grove, wearing our new Indigenous guernseys secured through a Cadbury Grant (many thanks to the committed women players who made the video that won us the grant!) Big thanks also to Uncle Mikey O'Brien for coming to the club to talk to the players in the preceding week and for doing the Welcome to Country before the A grade women's game.

The women's program continued to develop in ways that just fills us with pride. We had exceptional collaboration across the U17.5 girls and senior women's teams, with some players playing two games on a weekend to make sure we had the numbers to take to the field (COVID will not hold us down!). We also continued to build and strengthen our relationship with the men's program, which started with several A grade men players volunteering to assist with pre-season training while we were managing some last-minute coaching changes. There were also some great events organised by our highly energetic social committee, with lots of fun had by all (myself included!)

As indicated, we had some coaching changes in 2022, with our exemplary coach Kathryn Harrison moving to Kangaroo Island for the duration of the footy season, to take up a not-to-be-missed career opportunity. 2021 assistant coach Shane Pill stepped into the senior coach role and continued the successful trajectory started by Kathryn. Our 2021 B grade senior coach Mary Smith accepted the A grade assistant coach role and was replaced by Jordan Dodd, who led the D2R side supported by Viv Williams as assistant coach. Dan Scott continued his valued tenure as U17.5 Girls senior coach. Each of the coaches provided a brief season recap, reported as follows:

Division 3 Women – Shane Pill

A core group of around 25 players consistently attended pre-season training. In a disrupted initial start to the pre-season, a group of players **'held things together' while coaches were unavailable**. Thanks to Emma Whyte, Jazi Andrea, Mhairi Madigan and Carly Payne for the awesome effort keeping things going during the early weeks of the pre-season.

Due to injury and changing commitments there were 10 players from the D4 2021 premiership team unavailable going into the 2022 season, so it was a **'very different looking' team from the premiership team that played pre-season trial games against Norwood Payneham Union (D1) and Flinders University (D2)**. These games proved to be very challenging but ended up not representative of how the D3 team would perform during the season. For the season, the D3 team lost just one game, away to Golden Grove, and finished minor premiers. The finals season saw us hold our form and progress to the grand final. The D3 Grand Final opponent was Brighton. It was a highly defensive game, with Brighton often bringing a half forward to the midfield to congest play and dropping a mid behind the play. We stayed with our structure and backed our contest method to give us the advantage when the ball was in dispute. The game developed into a battle of contest wins and defence efforts. Brighton relied on winning the ball in D50 and counter attacking, but we mostly **held them up in midfield when that happened. Our 'back 6' were fabulous in their 1on1's when Brighton did manage to get forward.**



It was quite the achievement to get the double: minor premiers and competition premiers. Thanks to Mary Smith and Simon Stapleton for their coaching this year. Thanks also to Cecilia Moretti **for performing 'on and above' as women's football director and team manager for D3 team.**

Goodwood Saints players performed well in the 2022 AdFL Medal Count with Mim Potter and Jess Chyer polling equal 5th in D3. Our Goodwood Saints Club Awards went to Annalise Size (Best and Fairest), Madelyn Griffiths (Runner-Up Best and Fairest), Emma Whyte (Best Team Player), Sarah Dempsey (Coaches Award) and Jessica Chyer (Tiny Things).

Division 2 Reserves Women – Jordan Dodd

The D2R team had a highly successful year despite a tentative start. The first game of the season at Henley saw the team and coaching staff together for the first time, and even with a loss it was clear there was depth and potential in the side.

The team developed strong bonds throughout the season, and often called on personal connections to fill spots on a Saturday in a season riddled with Covid and injury (a special thanks to Football Director Cecilia Moretti for pulling on the boots for her debut). Even with an ever-changing roster the team improved week to week, sitting comfortably second on the ladder by halfway through the season and maintaining that position until the end. An inspiring and impressive win in the first round of finals against rivals Tea Tree Gully ensured the team a grand final berth, but regrettably TTG were the stronger team on the big day.

The team was an absolute joy to coach, and it was a privilege to be surrounded by such positive, uplifting, and supportive players. Every person in the D2R side exemplified good sportsmanship both on and off the field and I could not have been prouder **to be their coach. Our Goodwood Saints Club Awards went to Chelsea Talbot (Best & Fairest), Chelsea Matthews (Runner Up Best & Fairest), Kayla Wilkie (Best Team Player), Racheal Sharman (Coaches Award) and Maria Sharp (Tiny Things Award).

U17.5 Girls – Daniel Scott

Season 2022 was always going to be an exciting one as we had a team that could achieve success from a skill point a view. They were a talented group of players with some coming into their fourth year of playing football. Besides being a talented group of players, the U17.5 girls should be most proud of how they are as people and how they represented themselves and the club. The season started with a pre-season camp at Middleton which was a huge success and something that many will cherish for a long time. Luke Braddy was our runner throughout the whole year, and it was a pleasure to have him by my side. Thank you to Will Chapman as well for his support at the camp and during the season as well.

Thanks again to all the parents, committee, support staff, volunteers and the many people in the background who make the football club great. Thanks to our Head of Football Daniel Norton and Female Football Director Cecilia Moretti for their support throughout the year. It has been a pleasure to have been able to be the head coach of this program for the last five years and I see a big future **ahead for girls' football here at Goodwood.**

U9 Girls - Luke Dixon

The U9 girls team coached by Luke Dixon had an excellent turn out, fielding 12 players of a possible squad of 14. There are no scores kept in U9G, but the team was very competitive and had a great season, showing improvements in fundamental skills and understanding of the game. The girls were only challenged in one game, adapted well to different ground and weather conditions, and the final game in the wet everyone kicked at least one goal and most girls power-slid in the mud afterwards! Players were rotated through all positions and in different combinations and played almost equal time on field across the season. Off field, the U9G team consisted of a great group of girls who brought fantastic energy and effort. Everyone grew their confidence and independence as young girls across the season, all made new friendships within the team, took on the challenges including running the entire final training session, and the team dinner at The Moseley was a highlight. These young girls have set a very bright path for the future!

The biggest challenge was getting enough numbers for a team. Luke recommended dedicating more effort earlier with promotion to schools, come and try days, and flagging availability with current club families who might have a daughter that's eligible to join.

U11 Girls – Matt Harris

The U11 girls team coached by Matt Harris had a fantastic year, following a mantra and focus on fun and development. Numbers were excellent both in squad size and throughout trainings and games. A program strength was holding trainings for all junior girl teams on the same night. Music played a big part at trainings, along with a lot of game-based training drills. The team also participated in number of events off the field, seen as vital for the girls who were close as a group. Season highlights included the Growing With Gratitude session and the team dinner, which was attended by every player and their parents (the \$500 per team offering by the club was very well received). The End of Year Go Cart Session was also extremely popular. Next year there are plans for the girls to go on a camp.

U13 Girls – Carrie Lamming

The 2022 U13 girls Goodwood Saints team consisted of 21 girls, at least five of whom had never played football before. Despite their inexperience, the girls started the season in brilliant form, winning three of their first four games. Unfortunately, their success led to regrading into the Central Division 1, at which point the games became much more challenging. While some games were extremely tough, the girls never gave up and continued to try their hardest in every match.

The team was coached by Carrie Lamming, supported by Zara Bowles and Ben Weyland. As usual, there was great support from the parents and Goodwood community, with an endless supply of volunteers to ensure each game ran without a hitch.

The season was bookended by two great team building exercises - a pre-season camp at West Beach Caravan Park and night at an Escape Room followed by team presentations at the club. So, while we hope to improve our final position on the ladder next year, the friendships built, and sense of community meant 2022 was a successful season for the U13 Goodwood Saints girls team!

U15 girls – Matt Bedford

Matt Bedford coached the U15 girls in 2022. The team was comprised of a 'hybrid' of U13 and U15 players and new starters, amounting to 30 players. Following a successful 2021 season, the team was set to be challenged in Division 1 in 2022. The coaching team built a set of team principles, planned a game style, and commenced a 12-week preseason training in early February 2021 to develop the style of play. Matt reported that, as predicted, we encountered seasoned U15-player teams with overall average game play experience higher than our team. We were not contenders in the finals series this season however we competed at the highest level which assisted our players in further developing their fundamental skills, tactical knowledge of the game, overall perception, decision-making and problem-solving abilities. From a scoreboard perspective the girls gave it everything in each game and won four of the fourteen minor round games, which coupled with the overall player development was a great achievement considering the opposition team experience.



Matt also made special mention of several fantastic achievements this season. Chloe Tonkin and Lucy Waye were selected and represented SA in the U15 Girls School Sport Australia Championships in Lavington, NSW. SA finished second with WA, behind QLD. Congratulations to Chloe Tonkin for also being selected in the School Sport All-Australian Team. From a SANFLW U14 and U16 Development Squad perspective it is with great honour to report that all our U15 players who trialed were selected. Our players selected for the U16 West Adelaide Squad included Sophia Edwards, Lucy Waye, and Chloe Tonkin. Our players selected for the U16 Sturt Squad included Maddie Revell and Saskia Reynolds. Our players selected for the U14 West Adelaide Squad included Poppy Lea, Sage Spencer, Abbie Healey, Tayla Wilkinson and Sachi Simmonds. Congratulations to all players involved in the SANFLW Development Squads.

This season the U15 Girls club awards included a 'tie' in the Best and Fairest winners – Lucy Waye and Mia Krueger, who both received the most votes in game day voting for their skill and ability to impact the game on match day and who played within the rules of the game. 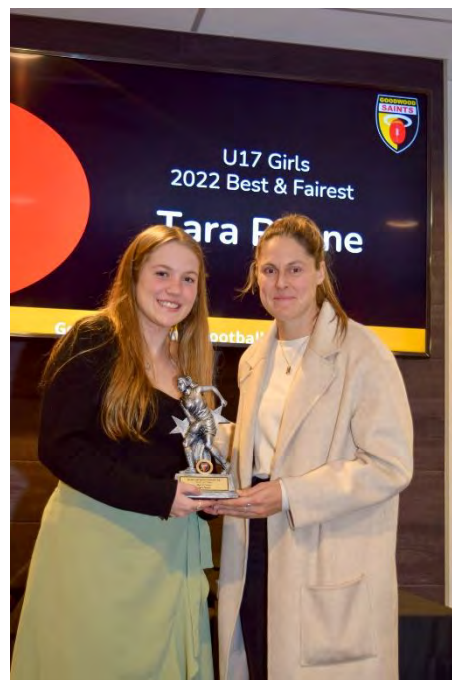

Club Achievements / 50 years of service – Mark “Goody” Goodman

At this year's Senior Presentation Night, Mark Goodman was recognised for his 50 Years of Service to the club.

Mark 'Goody' Goodman – possibly the most selfless person you've ever met. Mark first started at the club by boundary umpiring the B grade footy when he was 10 years old in 1972. His Dad, Allan would bring him out to the club, and he has been involved in some capacity as a volunteer ever since.

Over 50 years, Mark has filled most roles at the club, including Bar, Canteen, BBQ, match day set up, Social Director, management committee and as a player. His greatest impact on the club has been as the Junior Football Director where he started the junior football program for the **Saints. In the late 80's the club only had two junior teams, as a result of Mark's passion and drive and a small group of volunteers, a junior program was implemented that is now the envy of most other clubs. The club now fields 16 junior teams – five of which are girl's teams.** Numerous meetings – all out of hours - were spent formulating the Metro South Junior Football League with nine other clubs. Slowly but surely the league grew bigger and bigger, and eventually, the SANFL Juniors took over running the league due to its size and the enormous workload placed on the volunteers.



When Mark stepped down as Junior Football Director, he immediately took up the position of Facilities Manager. The Goodwood Oval complex was extremely old and run down and needed a lot of work and ultimately, a pathway to replace the building. Mark runs his own business – Goodman Plumbing, and any commitment to the club during the day costs him money. This has never deterred Mark and he has always made himself available day and night to assist the club to improve. With the announcement we had received funds from the then Labour Government to build a new club room, Mark was instrumental in the planning, designing and implementation of the new club rooms. As a result of Mark's dedication, we have been able to have a facility fit for purpose.

Mark arrives at Goodwood Oval on a Saturday morning at 7am to commence setting up the oval with a handful of other helpers. They set up marquees, put goal post paddings on, set up the BBQ & Bar area and rope off muddy areas. They set up the interchange bench with table, chairs and siren, coaches' area and put the bins around the ground. During COVID and the build, the workload was twice as much. Mark then starts cooking the BBQ with a small band of helpers in between driving off to check on some work to be done or fixing an emergency plumbing problem. At the end of match day, the pack up commences, marquees folded and put away, rubbish and bottles collected and placed in the bins, BBQ trailer cleaned up and put away, chairs packed away, goal post paddings stored and change rooms tidied.



This is just a small cross section of what Goody does for our club.

We would like to advise all members of the Saints Family that when you now go to the club for a drink in the footy season, you will be drinking at 'The Goody Bar', named in recognition of Mark's 50 years of service to the Goodwood and Goodwood Saints Football Clubs.

Many of our community may not have had the pleasure of meeting Goody or knowing of his enormous commitment to the club. Many of you will and know just how deserving of recognition he is. Thank you Mark for everything you do.
