Once again Goodwood Saints has completed a successful season in 2015, with both our A grade and C grade sides winning Premierships. The B Grade and Under 18 sides both made the finals with the 18's just falling short in their Grand Final. Our C7 team also played finals finishing third. Congratulations to all the coaches and players for an outstanding season.

The club was also well represented by 10 junior teams from U7s through to U16.5 with 3 teams contesting finals. These teams together with the Auskick programme will ensure a steady stream of players through to our senior ranks for many years. Let's hope some of these boys will be future SANFL and AFL stars. The club also fielded an U13 Girls' Team again this year who were coached by Robert Fuller with Cecilia Moretti as Team Manager. A big thankyou to the Junior Committee for their great work throughout the year and also to the coaches, team managers and volunteers who helped put all the sides on the field each week.

Football clubs such as ours would struggle to continue, without the generous support of our sponsors. One area that we must focus our attention on in 2016 and beyond will be the state of our facilities. Given the physical and financial restrictions we face regarding increasing the overall size of the club rooms. I see this as an important step in making our club a more modern and welcoming entity.

I would like to thank the Management Committee for their efforts throughout the year, the amount of work done behind the scenes is remarkable. A special thank you to Kim Verrall who unsuccessfully tried to leave the committee at the end of 2014, however because we were unable to fill the vacancies she found herself taking on the roles of Treasurer, Secretary and Canteen Manager this year. Thanks Kim.

To all the volunteers who helped with the multitude of tasks that have to be completed each weekend, also thank you. We couldn't do it without you.

It is important that each of us who identifies with Goodwood Saints ensures that all of our players, male and female, together with our supporters, spectators and umpires can enjoy their football in a safe environment.

Congratulations to everyone involved with the club for another successful year.

2015 ANNUAL REPORT Treasurer's Report

Congratulations to the club on yet another successful year on the field including back to back premierships for the A and C grade. On field success makes all the hard work behind the scenes all the more worthwhile.

Financially 2015 was not as successful, resulting in an expected loss for the year. The major reason for this was the introduction of a paid Administrator. The committee felt this was the only option due to the increasing requirements of running a football club and the decreasing time volunteers have available. Other points to note from the 2015 Profit & Loss include:

- Sponsorship income increased markedly thanks to the perseverance of Colin Shipton. A mighty effort thanks Col.

- Senior football costs increased due to the new Guernseys purchased and increases in medical supplies and umpire fees.
- Repairs and maintenance costs were primarily for the Cool Room condenser repair required.

The challenge next year will be to bring the club back in the black so we can maintain our reserves and be in a strong financial position moving forward.

I would like to thank all those who assisted in any capacity this year, with special thanks to Dale Fitzpatrick for again co-ordinating player sponsorship, Con Eleftheriou for shaking his tin every Thursday and Saturday night and all those who assisted with fundraising events this year. 2015 ANNUAL REPORT A Grade (Division 1) Coach's Report

It was another extremely successful season for the senior football department. Congratulations must go to Scott for taking his Under 18 side to another Grand Final, unfortunately falling agonisingly close. Adam again led his C Grade side to another Premiership which is a marvellous effort and Daryl blooded many young players this year through the B Grade and was still able to lead the side to a Preliminary Final. The work of Daryl, Scott and Adam leaves the club in good stead with many junior players making their way through the grades.

The pre-season was again at Concordia and Daryl put together a program that continued to improve on the previous years increased intensity and focus on the game plan and style we wanted to play.

With players retiring, moving back home to the country, taking time off to go overseas or leaving the club, there was seven changes from the previous years A Grade Premiership side.

The minor round saw a reasonably consistent performance with only four losses for the year and we finished the minor round in second place. It was again great to see past juniors of the club make their A Grade debut or get to taste more A Grade football with the likes of Loucas Theodoulou, Angus Clarke, Addison Burns, Josh Slape and Reid Pinto, either debuting for the club or adding to their senior experience. Congratulations must also go to Lou Whitelock who represented the club in the State under 23 team.

We had again made it to a finals series and were to face Henley in the qualifying final. This was a tough game which saw us stick to the game style and process; we have worked on, all day and come away with a hard fought victory.

Next on the agenda was an away second semi-final clash with Tea Tree Gully, who we hadn't beaten this year so far. We went out there with a plan and executed it nearly perfectly coming away with an 89 point victory. This meant we were into our eight Grand Final in twelve years as a club with the opportunity to win our seventh Premiership in that time.

Grand Final day was a little different from the six I have previously been involved in. We took on Payneham Norwood Union who had beaten us in the last minor round game. Unlike the previous six Premierships we were not at our best on Grand Final day, just lacking a little intensity and clean use of the football. Some of this was due to the pressure Norwood Payneham Union put on us. However as great sides do we were able to hang in all day and there were signs at the start of the second half that things were starting to click. Despite being a goal down at three quarter time we were able to run out 28 point victors and add a seventh Premiership in eleven years for the club.

It really is only at this time of year you get a chance to look back at what we have achieved as a club and in the eleven years I have been at the club to have won seven Premierships and finish no lower than third is an absolute credit to the players, the club and all the volunteers that have made this club what it is today.

I have said many times this year that all football clubs have great volunteers that work tirelessly for their football clubs to survive. I believe one of the differences at our football club is that we have a lot more of those people that are willing to do what it takes for our club to be successful. I would like to thank Chris Gates and all the management committee for their ongoing support and work they put in to ensure the club runs smoothly.

The club legends in Colin "Tiny" Nelson, Hans Ellenbroek, Mark Goodman and Craig Kirkbright and many others are why this club is such a success.

On the playing side of things, I'd like to especially thank Daryl Spencer for his support and work in improving many facets of our football department and his commitment to blooding young Goodwood Saints talent. I'd also like to thank David Bartel, Adrian Burton, Murray Hamblin and Paul Clarke that all helped out as the team runner at various times throughout the year. Brett Perry continued his often thankless task of football director and provided great support and accommodated any need we had as a football coaching group. His efforts are much appreciated. A big thank you to Jon Pysing who is always there especially when recruiting is needed. With a turnaround of seven players from a Premiership side his work this year was phenomenal with the recruits we were able to obtain. Thanks also to Adam Morgan for his support and role as C Grade coach.

I would like to acknowledge the work of all of our medical team including, Scott, Sean and Luke from the Physio Studio - they provide great assistance to all the players at the club and without them we would not be able to put a team on the field each week. Hans Ellenbroek continued his great work for the club assisting in the medical area along with Nadia, Megan, Eva, Kiana and Sophie.

A special mention must go to Craig Kirkbright who not only is a great Team Manager but his assistance and rapport with the playing group is invaluable and often what keeps the side together.

I would also like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the great support of my family that allows me to coach and be a part of the club. Without this from my wife Emma, who does a magnificent job given the time I spend at work and coaching, then I would not be able to continue.

Finally one of the main reasons why we coach is for the playing group and they again need to be congratulated on the way they have conducted themselves and I have pleasure being involved with them and look forward to working with and continuing to develop them next year.

The club has had an unprecedented past twelve years due to the hard work of many stakeholders within the club but we all need to continue to put in this hard work to ensure we stay at the top of Division One.

This year was a great development platform for that future success to spring from, with 54 players being exposed to a season that provided all the learning experiences you could ask for in games where we:

- Found a way to beat every team in the competition.
- Lost three games by less than a goal

- Had to win 8 of last 9 games to make finals
- Played in 3 pressure finals games

Driven by the team leaders – Ben Johnston, Josh Slape, Harrison Ellis, Andrew Caire and Max Duncan – this is an outstanding core group of people who should be very proud of their contribution this year.

Thank you to the other members of the coaching team, Kym Hand, Paul Clarke and Chris Verrall, who once again provided all the support I could have asked for in assisting me to coach.

Congratulations and thanks to: Trent, Kirk and the A grade team on setting a great successful example for us to follow, and, Adam Morgan and the C grade group on your premiership success and support as needed, and Scott Uppington and those U18 players who were prepared to have a crack with us.

Vital to our club in offering a professional environment for our players is the contribution of our Physio and Medical team lead by Luke, Sean and Scott. 2015 ANNUAL REPORT C1 Grade Coach's Report

Firstly we would like to congratulate our teammates, committee and fellow members, on yet another successful season for the Goodwood Saints Football Club –

- The A1's winning the coveted A1 Premiership,
- The A1 Reserves doggedly fighting their way thru to the Prelim Final and
- The Under 18's playing off in yet another Grand Final.

After last year's incredible success, in 2015 - it was always going to be a tough act to follow. As a club, we were still successful in fulfilling our mission statement and being recognized as the Premier Football Club within the South Australian Amateur Football League.

The C1 side is here to play a simple role; we are here to support the A1 Reserves. The side acts as a conduit for Players, to develop their game to the next level. Be that a 1st year Senior Player coming out of the Under 18's, a Reserves Player returning from Injury or a lay off back to the Reserves and beyond.

In 2015 the C1 side fielded 55 players, 20 odd players were promoted to the Reserves, and we debuted 15 First Year Senior players and welcomed 8 new players to the club. That is a role we are proud to successfully undertake. It is part of a program that owes its success to people like Mark Goodman, Kym Hand, Craig Scott, Scott Uppington, Shaun Gillespie, Kym Bennett and Dion Stendt – who silently work behind the scenes encouraging and ensuring that the Under 18 and Junior programs are a success and that the players coming out of those programs, can successfully transition to Senior Football, at The Saints.

That successful transition needs a structure that can help develop the player's skills and abilities and there are no better coaches in this League than Trent Mills and Daryl Spencer. The players and their parents can be assured, that their sons will get the very best in coaching available, when they play for the Goodwood Saints Football Club.

Whilst on that note I would like to thank both Trent and Daryl for their support of the C1's - and in particular acknowledge the attention to detail that Daryl initiated prior to the Finals campaign in ensuring all of the C1 regulars who had pushed up to Reserves during the season, still qualified for C1 Finals. The Players Final reward a Premiership would not have been possible without that foresight and benefit.

In addition, the support the C1 's received from the Under 18's a week after their devastating loss in their Grand Final, is yet another great example of the various departments of the Footy Club working together.

To cut a long story short, after the C1 loss in the 2nd Semi Final with one thing and another, we potentially had 17-18 fit players available - Injuries, players overseas and a wedding on the West Coast had left us short going in to the Prelim. The request was made that any Under 18's who were available to play C1's would be welcomed. Of course there were no guarantees of playing that week or beyond – but put simply we needed their help.

With Scotty, Kellsy and Dizzies support, we had six Under 18 players attend training on the Tuesday, fresh off their Grand Final loss. They committed to the process with a clear understanding and for that I commend them. The C1 Prelim was to be a Home Final v Henley,

(who coincidently played a few Under 18 and overage players themselves) and we witnessed 5 of the best from the Saints Under 18 program, playing alongside the old and not so old C1 Saints players. The end result was a hard fought 13-point victory and a Grand Final berth for the Saints the following week. The Under 18's who played in the Preliminary Final all played well and featured prominently in the Best Players and Goal Kickers

The 2015 season was good to us, we were lucky not to have any serious injuries, although we came very close. Jack Morgan, a 1st Year player, from last years Under 18 Premiers, received a serious concussion in that Prelim Final. Fortunately thanks to the First responders from both clubs on the day, Jack has recovered well and no serious injury was sustained.

We have promoted players throughout the grades, we have introduced 1st year senior players, we debuted new players to the club. 2015 ANNUAL REPORT Under 18's Coach's Report

I would like to start by congratulating Adam Morgan & the C1 boys on winning another Premiership. It was a lot of fun helping Adam out for part of the finals & I thank him for this. Congratulations also to Trent Mills & Daryl Spencer on achieving the ultimate with the A grade – any year you win an A grade flag is a successful year as ultimately this is what we're judged on by others. Great work men!

On to the U/18s. Certainly the experience of last year had helped the coach in being more organised & the pre-season was met with great optimism. Things started a little earlier this year with the first session at Concordia in the first week of February. With the addition of several new players, the boys coming up from the U/16s & the competition changing from U/18s to 18.5, training numbers were very healthy right from the start. A solid pre-season ensued & it was also pleasing to see many of the players doing the other sessions with the seniors.

The league made the decision in pre-season to essentially set-up a Division 1 & 2 for the U/18s competition - a move I fully supported as it would only enhance the development of our group. As we were to discover there were no easy games in this division & you only had to be a little bit off on any day to get beaten, no matter who the opposition was.

By the time round 1 rolled around, we hadn't actually played a trial game together so I felt it would take a little while for the group to gel. The first assignment was against Payneham who had won the U/18 Red division last year. From very early in the game you could tell they were a good side – very physical. As it turned out we would have some great battles against Payneham throughout the season. It was tight all day but a late goal from Henry Curtis got us over the line. Following a solid win over Tea Tree Gully, it was an honour & privilege to play a game under lights after the A grade on Anzac Day. It was great to have Henry Clarke back at the club, after being on loan elsewhere, as he put on a show this night. Two more wins followed & we hit our bye week at 5-0. Following a solid win over Golden Grove we had our first loss of the season in round 8 to lowly ranked Henley – this proved to the team that no matter who you play if you don't show up you'll get beaten this year. Post June long weekend we had a solid win over Modbury before the top of the table clash with Payneham. This was one of our better performances for the year. Our first quarter pressure this day was manic & set the tone for a 6 goal win. We were now top at 9-1, which seemed to be the catalyst for us getting a little bit ahead of ourselves. We went on to lose 3 of our next 4 games – what was concerning was the manner of the losses. A team meeting followed at training to reiterate some standards. Round 16 was a season defining game for the group. A win over Golden Grove would virtually seal a top two finish. After being 20 pts down at half-time, our Captain, Bek Garner & Jordan Pressler were instrumental in a confidence building come from behind win. Two wins to finish the minor round meant we finished 2nd with a 12-4 record, meaning a double chance home final against Golden Grove in week one. The boys looked particularly focused pre-game & it showed as we got off to a flyer. Alex Gillett was instrumental early, but by ³/₄ time we had left the door ajar. The team stood tall in the last quarter to record a comfortable 5 goal win. We were now one win from the GF with a Second Semi to come against the side who all year I've thought are the team to beat, Payneham. We started okay but Payneham's physicality had us on the back foot & we trailed by 34 points at half-time. While there were several off the ball incidents missed by the umpires it was pleasing that our boys stood up for themselves in the second half. Our guys had simply had enough of being push around – we drew a line in the sand! The second half was guite even & Payneham ran out 48 point winners. The message post game was that we've been here before so there was no need for panic. A home prelim final followed against Flinders Park, a side we hadn't played since the

middle of the year so we knew going in it would be no easy task. It wasn't a game that reached any great heights, mainly due to the opposition trying to congest things. We led all day but wasn't until we built a 5 goal lead halfway through the last quarter that we could start thinking about the GF. 3 late goals by Flinders Park saw us run out 10 point winners. So we were going back to the big dance!

A very hot 29 degree day greeted us for the GF. I was very confident going in that it wouldn't be anything like the second semi & no matter who won it would be tight. The message pre-game was that if we were prepared to run, be just as physical as Payneham & bring the kind of pressure we did against them in round 10 that we would be in it up to our ears. We had the aid of a stiff breeze in the first stanza & our pressure around the ball helped us build a 14 point lead. We hung on for most of the second quarter but a couple of late goals by Payneham gave them an 11 point half-time lead – game on! The first ten minutes of the third guarter we simply couldn't get our hands on the footy. Payneham got out to a 20 point lead & I won't lie - I thought we were gone. From this moment on we dominated, the boys dug in for the fight & by ³/₄ time we were only 5 points down. You could see late in the third quarter that perhaps some of Payneham's bigger bodies were starting to get a bit tired. Kicking into a strong breeze in the last guarter the message at ³/₄ time was run & carry into the wind & we did exactly that – all of sudden we were really starting to exploit them for pace. We certainly had our chances in the last quarter that amazingly didn't have a goal kicked but unfortunately the end result was a heart-breaking 2 point loss. On the whiteboard post game I wrote two words – "shattered" & "proud." I think this was my proudest day as a coach. From where we were in the third quarter, the boys showed tremendous character & resilience. A lesser group would've given up but we dug in.

Amazing the difference in emotions from last year to this year, last year I wrote how seeing the pure exhilaration on the boys faces post game was an enormous thrill for me, this year seeing how heart-broken & shattered the players were was bloody hard. I know also that this was a few GF losses in a row for some of our players – just let it keep driving you harder boys! While we might not have quite got the result we were after, everyone involved in the group should feel enormously proud of their efforts for the whole season.

Here are some stats & highlights of our season.....

- Obviously playing off in another GF.
- 40 players represented the U/18s this year.
- Several players who were able to play games at SANFL clubs at both reserves & U/18s level.
- Several players who played multiple games in our B grade side.
- Seeing the boys develop, on a team & individual level, not just as footballers but as people.

Of course our success this year would not have been possible without the tireless contributions of a number of people off the field. I would like to thank the following, I hope I don't miss anyone but if I do then apologies but you're all special & a huge part of what makes this club so great. In no particular order - Kim Verrall, Chris Verrall, Craig Kirkbright, Craig Scott, Tiny Nelson, Tiny's mate - Russell, Nugget Rees, Jon Pysing, Con Eleftheriou, Dion Stendt, Hans Ellenbroek, Chris Gates and John Read.

To some other people that deserve a special mention. All the parents for being so supportive of me. Brett Perry for providing such strong support as Football Director. To Sharon Partington, thank you for all your help with all of the registrations and any administration work. Mark Goodman, who as we all know works tirelessly for the club. Yogie, our resident water boy most

weeks. Kym Hand – again you're a star – always happy to help and offer advice and field a lot of my phone calls! To the other senior coaches – Trent Mills, Daryl Spencer and Adam Morgan – thank you for being so
